Report for August – January 2025

Wednesday, February 5th, 2025

Dear Pastor & Brethren:

We wish you all a blessed & fruitful 2025. Although we have not written regularly, we have been very occupied with the ministry. All our 4 online classes during the weekdays are on going even when we were in Singapore as we are certain of our accessibility to be online.

In early September, we were at Lighthouse Baptist Church, Singapore, where I spoke for Pastor Sean. In mid-September we visited our preacher friends in Vietnam. We travelled between Ho Chi Minh City & the Central regions, even venturing into Laos to visit a tribal church. By God's grace, we are supporting 20+ preachers in Vietnam out of a total of 42. About 10 of them are tribal and we were able to meet those we did not meet in our last trip 2 years ago. Ps. Viet of Danang Bible Baptist Church graciously helped us by driving us to many of these less accessible places. We took night buses with sleeping berths in between cities to save time and money. Ruina, our sixth daughter, sponsored our flight tickets and accommodations, accompanied us about half of our 18-day trip. It was great to see such great progress in Church work in Vietnam. I was privileged to preach in their services, school chapels, Bible studies with the English class students, home Bible studies and personal devotions.





In December, we were with **two camps** in Johor Bahru: our home Church and Maranatha Baptist Church, Singapore. We got back just in time for our Christmas Sunday. Thousands of tracts were given out, but none responded.

Sunday, 26th January, we had our first Mandarin Bible Study led by Bro. Gideon with just 1 student. This contact we have through Ps. Choy of Lifegate Baptist Church, Johor Bahru, when he came here to preach. We hope to have more Mandarin-speaking visitors in the future.

Bro. Wing Aung, officially, a Myanmar refugee was baptised 7 years. He returned to His homeland some years



ago when there was national peace and unification under the Aung San Suu Kyi government. He returned to Malaysia some months ago when he was enlisted into the national army. He has gotten a job in Kepong, and is leading a group of His people in Sunday Services. He was with us two Sundays ago to share about his plight. His wife and two

children are still in Myanmar. Do pray that he may be united with his family.





Myanmar nationals rounded up

He just reported yesterday that a total of 28 of his fellow citizens were arrested in Kepong. Some of them were with his fellowship. Some are just illegal immigrants; some are officially refugees registered with the UNCHR. However, even those UN refugees are not permitted to work, and will be jailed, when caught, then repatriated to Myanmar upon released. Those that had ran away from enlistment will face many problems when sent back.

Bro. ThangPhwe, another Myanmar refugee whom I had been working with for years, till last year, when he was expected to be resettled in the U.S. Seems like there's snag now with a new policy. He was also requesting to work with us again. My goal in working with these people is to train them to build indigenous New Testament churches in the long run. Do pray with us for these people.
