


What is life without God?





The universe will then be eerily silent, cold, dark, expanding, and erasing its cosmic past forever.



Without God, man will always be searching for answers in an answerless world. In philosophy, this is known as Absurdism. The universe did not have us in mind, and we are just a lucky cosmic accident that happens to have happened. There are no reasons to our existence – there are no plans or purposes behind an accident. 

Why are there the exact number of the laws of nature?

Why are the laws of nature fine-tuned?



Why are all living things made up of molecular machines?

A living cell is a biological factory with a digital software (DNA), control center (nucleus), highways (microtubules), powerhouse (mitochondrion), postal service (Golgi apparatus), gateway (nuclear pore), transporters (Kinesin), etc.


Michael Behe: The cumulative results show with piercing clarity that life is based on machines – machines made of molecules! Molecular machines haul cargo from one place in the cell to another along "highways" made of other molecules, while still others act as cables, ropes, and pulleys to hold the cell in shape... In short, highly




sophisticated molecular machines control every cellular process. Thus, the details of life are finely calibrated and the machinery of life enormously complex.


And we know that no machine with specified, moving, and coordinated parts is ever built bottom up naturally, but always top down by design. And living machines with its billions of multifaceted parts are vastly more complex than man-made machines – they are self-replicating machines that can build identical copies of themselves indefinitely.




The Kinesin or motor protein in our cell has 'two legs with gears' and walks along the microtubules to deliver the vesicles to its designated locations to be assembled with the other organelles into functioning molecular machines. Do view "Motor Protein" (YouTube)



The E. coli is a bacterium that lives in our guts. Scientists are amazed that it has a tail-like flagellum that is propelled by a motor similar to an outboard motor. It has a stator, a drive shaft, a rotor, and spins at 100,000 rpm forward or backward to catch its food. Unlike our man-made machines, it is powered by protons instead of electrons, making it arguably the most efficient machine in the world. All living things are made up of molecular factories, machines, software, microprocessors, operating systems, switches, etc. from bacterium to plant to man. Living things are not a hodgepodge of chemical compounds accidentally put together but are intelligibly assembled, molecular machines!



Why are living things governed by a computer code?

The DNA, which consists of 4 chemical letters (ACTG), is a genetic code that determines whether the creature is a dog, cat, or human being. The human DNA is a 'single sentence' of about 3.1 billion exact digital code and, if unwound, would be approximately 6 foot long.



The DNA operates as a computer code that defines our species and regulates our functions. It can be read both forward and backward, split and recombined with other segments (alternate splicing), and is controlled largely by the epigenome to produce the required proteins in our body. The DNA has even a code reader to translate the DNA code into the proteins in our body! About 20,000 coding genes in the human body can generate about 100,000 different proteins.

Every living creature is literally a 3-D printer which transcribes a 2-dimension DNA code and translate it into 3-dimension proteins, and assemble them into every molecular machine imaginable for its survival.

DNA is like a computer program but far, far more advanced than any software ever created.


